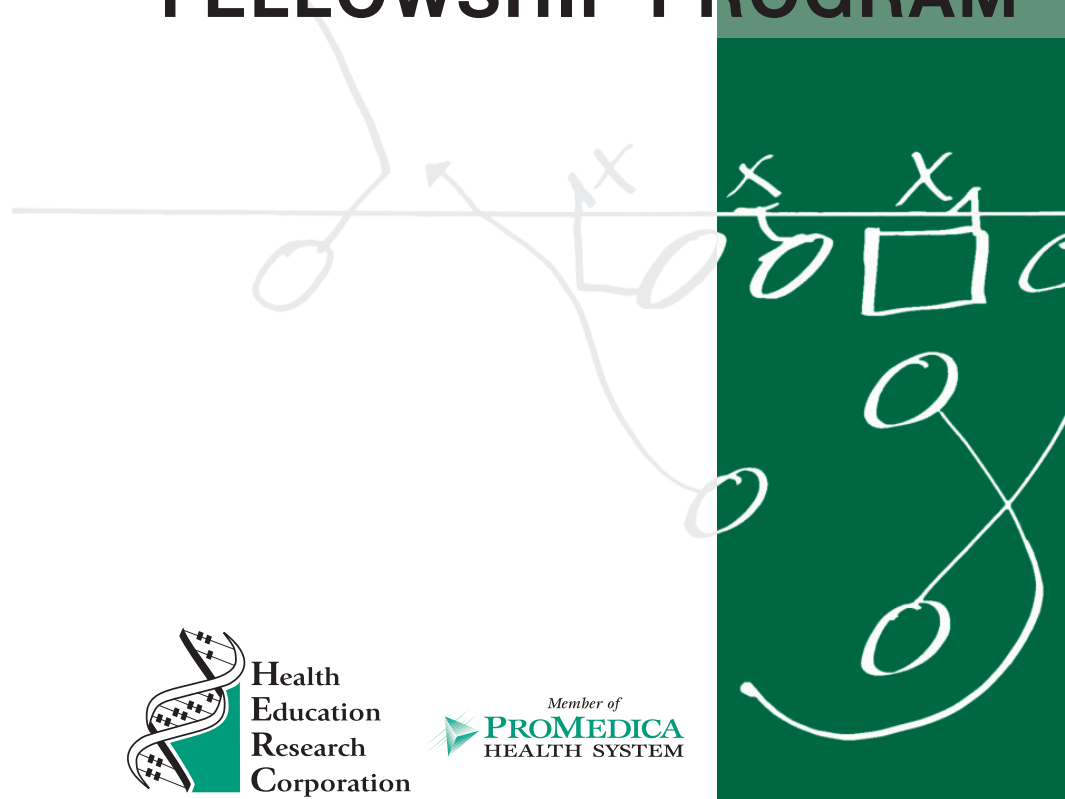


# SPORTS MEDICINE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

***Roger Kruse, MD***, is the program director for the sports medicine residency and the head team physician at The University of Toledo.

Dr. Kruse has extensive Olympic experience and was involved in the 1994 Winter Olympic Games in Lillhammer, Norway; the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta; the 1998 Winter Olympic Games in Nagano, Japan, where he served as head physician for the U.S. Olympic Team; and the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Additionally, Dr. Kruse has overseen drug testing at many national and international events. Dr. Kruse is board-certified in family practice medicine and is a fellow member of the American College of Sports Medicine and a member of the American Medical Society of Sports Medicine. He earned his undergraduate degree from The Ohio State University and his medical training at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine.

***Steven Freeman, MD***, is an associate director for the sports medicine residency and provides care for many local athletic teams including The University of Toledo. Dr. Freeman graduated from Medical University of Ohio and completed his residency with The Toledo Hospital Family Practice Residency Program. He also completed his fellowship training in sports medicine at The Toledo Hospital.



***Luke Ragan, MD***, is an associate director for the sports medicine residency and provides sports medicine coverage for the Toledo Mud Hens, The University of Toledo and various local community events. Dr. Ragan also is employed by Toledo Orthopaedic Surgeons. He earned his undergraduate degree at Wittenberg University and his medical degree at Medical University of Ohio. Sinai Medical Center East in Richmond Heights, Ohio, and a residency at The Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He is also a graduate of The Toledo Hospital Primary Care Sports Medicine Residency.



***Cathy Cantor, MD, MBA***, obtained both her undergraduate and master's degrees from the University of Alabama. Her medical degree was earned from the University of South Alabama.
